In principle, neurosurgery focuses on the surgical treatment of diseases and injuries of the nervous system. However, it is not only a question of surgery. The previous analysis of the clinical picture, the diagnostic findings and the decision for or even against a surgical intervention are as important. The actual surgery already starts with the planning. Which route through the inner skull is the safest and the most efficient at the same time? Which supportive instruments can assist us in an effective way? Which implant should be chosen for spine surgery? There are standards, but there are also individual treatment measures. Eventually, the state-of-the-art technical equipment, which is available in the Klinikum Ingolstadt, is not sufficient. Only the special knowledge and the surgical experience guarantee the successful treatment of the patient. The Neurosurgery Clinic of Klinikum Ingolstadt also performs surgeries of the highest degree of difficulty on an international top level. This is what my team and I stand and vouch for. Incidentally, a close cooperation is maintained with the Neurology Clinic under the management of Prof. Dr. Günther Ochs, director, the Institute for Diagnostic and Interventional Radiology under the management of Prof. Dr. Dierk Vorwerk, director, the Surgical Clinic II under the management of Dr. Michael Wenzl, director and private lecturer, as well as with the the Clinic for Anaesthesiology and Intensive Medicine under the management of Prof. Dr. Gunther Lenz, director.

## The area of responsibility

Neurosurgery focuses on the diagnostic evaluation and the surgical treatment of diseases of the central and peripheral nervous system. The clinic offers the entire neurosurgical range:

- Treatment of brain and medullary tumours
- Treatment of cerebral haemorrhages
- Treatment of cerebral vascular malformations
- Treatment of disturbed cerebral blood flows
- Paediatric neurosurgery
- Treatment of diseases of the pituitary gland
- Treatment of brain injuries, medullary injuries and injuries of the spine
- Treatment of slipped discs
- Implantation of replacement discs
- Stabilisation surgeries
- Treatment of neurological illnesses, nerve transplantations
- Pain and spastic therapy

In the clinic, neurosurgery is performed on the international standards level. The clinic maintains a continuous dialogue and cooperation with internationally renowned expert groups.
